SCHOOL EXCURSIONS

In 2020 we are asking all families to work more collaboratively with the school in relation to excursion notes and payments. Permission notes and payments for all excursions must be received by the closing date in order for the students to attend all excursions. Failure to provide the permission note and payment (if required) will result in your child / children not attending the excursion. Any families requiring financial assistance must complete the required paperwork which is available from the office or your child's classroom teacher.

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SCHOOL FEES INFORMATION 2020

Every year our school asks for contributions from our families in two areas. The first is a SUBJECT CONTRIBUTION which only partially covers the cost of online digital learning materials such as Mathletics, STARS/CARS, Reading Eggs, and School Magazines. The school actually covers part of the cost of these platforms for every student to reduce the potential financial strain on families. We expect that all families pay this fee. Further details about what is included in each SUBJECT CONTRIBUTION will be provided by the class teachers on parent information night.

Borrowing Tips

- Keep books in the library bag when you are not reading them
- Find a safe place in your home to keep the library bag and books and always store them in the same place as this will stop your child losing their library bag and books.
- Help students organise their Library bag and books the night before their library day
- Return books to the library each week Please notify the librarian of any damaged or lost books

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "Install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.





For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.



Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.




For Windows 8.1 Phone and Windows 8.1 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
3. Install the Skoolbag app
4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
6. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
7. Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

The audition process to become a dancer in a Star Struck featured dance ensemble has changed for 2020. Please read the information below carefully.

Applicants	Auditions are now open to all eligible students, regardless of their schools involvement in Star Struck 2020. Students who have a school involved may be supervised by their own school, while students without a school involved will be supervised by the Star Struck featured ensemble coordinator.
Round 1 <i>Cancelled</i>	Due to time constraints, the Round 1 video auditions will no longer go ahead. Instead we will move straight to the Round 2 live audition workshops for any students wanting to participate.
Round 2	Round 2 is a live audition workshop. Round 2 audition workshops for ballet and jazz will be held on Tuesday 18 February 2020 at The Forum and audition workshops for contemporary will be held on Tuesday 25 February 2020 at The Forum. Round 2 live tap audition workshops will be held on Sunday 23 February at Australian Dance and Talent Centre Studios. Please refer to the audition workshop schedule below for full details and information.
Audition information	Auditions will include a workshop, time to ask questions and gain advice from industry professionals, learning audition choreography and performing for a panel in small groups. There is no need to prepare a solo performance, students will not be asked to perform solo. Students may be asked to perform choreography designed for duos/partner work. They may be partnered with a younger or older student to perform movement at the audition. A select panel of choreographers, industry professionals and Star Struck directors will make up the selection panel. Please ensure students bring along a drink and snacks as they will be given adequate breaks throughout the audition workshop session.
Ensemble information	All students can audition and be accepted in ONLY 2 featured ensemble groups. You must nominate ONLY 2 featured ensembles on your form.
Application information	Please complete and submit the Star Struck dance ensemble audition form by clicking, typing or copying this link https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSe-dByblmATsh6fsOqynZSHd-1ZL_6J2qNDMku-9x9_iYKkg/viewform?usp=sf_link by Wednesday 12 February 2020 . Your form must include your @education email address as this is the address results will be sent to. You must have your principal's permission to audition for a Star Struck 2020 dance ensemble. Please ensure you inform them before you submit your application. Principals and schools will be notified of your submission and are aware of the audition fee.
Payment information	Students applying to participate in the round 2 audition workshops will be required to pay a \$40 fee. This fee will only be charged once, even if a student auditions for multiple dance styles or in other genres such as featured drama or featured music. Please pay this fee at your school office by Friday 14 February 2020 . Schools will be directly debited based on applications received.
Other information	Audition is only via the audition workshop process which will be conducted on the date and times outlined below only. Parents are unable to view the auditions. Parents are asked to drop students off and collect them at the end of their audition.

If a student is also involved in a school item then this participation fee will replace the \$30 fee associated with being involved in your school item.
