SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Last week we had Nate R & Grace K from Stage 2 represent NSW PSSA at the School Sport Australia National Athletics Championships from 23 to 27 November 2023 in Tasmania. In terms of results, Grace came 11th overall which is just sensational, and Nate came away with two 3rd third placings which is outstanding! One in the 200m and 3rd in the relay which is not surprising for anyone who has seen him run. To have the opportunity to compete at this level is truly remarkable and to finish so high up the rankings for Australia is just exceptional. We are all incredibly proud of you both!





CONNECTED COMMUNITY

You may have seen our Stage 3 tech leaders surveying parents at various events during the year via our iPads. Each year we attempt to measure how the community feels the school is travelling across seven key domains from the "Family-School Partnerships Framework". The domains are:

Communication
Connections with home & school
Building community and identity
Recognising the role of the family
Consultation on decision making
Collaboration beyond the school
Participation.

Each dimension includes a statement about the importance of the activity's contribution to strengthening engagement with families and the community to improve student learning outcomes. Families are simply asked to rate the school's performance against each dimension and make optional comments if they feel the need to do so. The feedback from this survey will help to us to plan school initiatives for the 2024 school year. Last year parents and carers told us that they wanted more information about bullying, cyberbullying and social media so we addressed that by holding an event outside of school hours led by the Inter-relate company. 


