SCHOOL BAND PROGRAM UPDATE

If your child is in Year 3-6 next year (2025) they can apply to be a part of this program at Point Clare Public School. Enrolment is via the Central Coast Conservatorium's website (link below and on attached flyer). The program is a fantastic way to introduce your child to an instrument and they get to learn alongside their peers in a program that is catered for all levels of musical ability. First time students will start in training band and learn the basics of learning to read music and be introduced to how to play their instrument. Rehearsals and group tutorials take place at the school during school hours with professional music teachers from the Conservatorium. Mr Makepeace is once again doing his part to raise funds to support 'Movember'. The Movember Foundation raises funds to support medical research, and mental health supports for men. TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY DATA

The school has been advised that for the eighth year in a row our school has recorded well below the NSW average for recorded bullying incidents. Students at PCPS have recorded on average that only 20% of students have experienced any



form of bullying incident in the past 12 months. This compares favourably with the NSW average of 29%. Impressively the data indicates that as the children progress through the grades the incidents of recorded bullying drop each year from Year 4 onwards with Year 6 showing the lowest average incidents in both reported genders. Year 6 boys recorded the lowest average rate with only 16% experiencing bullying in the last year. Full credit goes to the whole staff and the students for working hard on the lessons taught in peer support and child protection throughout the year. Well done everyone and thank you to Mrs McNamara, Mrs Lavelle and Mr Amos for their leadership in this space.

2025 ENROLMENTS & LEAVERS - REPEAT

As we approach the end of the school year it is essential that we have an accurate read on how many enrolments we will have to start the school year in 2025. Being accurate with our enrolment data helps to guarantee that children are placed in the appropriate class and that we have the right number of teachers available to start the school year. We politely request that any family who may be leaving the area let us know at your earliest possible convenience. I am very pleased to announce that our Kindergarten numbers for 2025 have continued to grow and we currently have 71 students enrolled and will be forming four classes at this point in time.

Students were able to borrow in week 6, however there will be no more borrowing from week 7 onwards, as the library prepares for the annual stocktake.




LIBRARY NEWS CONT.


