

STAFFING UPDATE 2025

This year we have commenced with 477 students which means that we cannot retain the Deputy Principal position. Mrs Rodwell will remain at the school until the end of 2027 as the Assistant Principal Curriculum & Instruction, but the school will need to adjust to not having the Deputy Principal position. SUBJECT CONTRIBUTIONS INFORMATION 2025

This year the school is charging a subject contribution that will cover the costs of digital subscriptions for software applications that will be used by the students. For the K-2 Students this year the cost will be: \$29.95. For this contribution the K-2 children will receive ongoing access to Life-skills Go, Essential Assessment Math & Essential Assessment Literacy. In grades 3-6 the subject contribution will be slightly higher as it also includes a handwriting textbook, and the software items listed above. For 3-6 children the subject contribution will be: \$43.45

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTIONS INFORMATION 2025 - REPEAT

Each year the school asks for families to contribute two types of funds. The first is the subject contributions which covers the costs of the digital subscriptions the children will use throughout the year. The second cost is the optional **VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION** that is used by the school to provide a range of supports to all students in the form of stationery, first aid supplies etc. These funds **are not compulsory** but are a great help to the school. Voluntary contributions for 2025 are capped as per the following:

Child 1 - \$51

Child 2 - \$41

Child 3 - \$31

Child 4 - \$0

STUDENT HEALTH CARE PLANS - REPEAT

It is important that parents notify the school if their child has an updated Health Care Plan, an allergy and/or is at risk of anaphylaxis. This notification should occur either at the time of enrolment, or if the student is already enrolled, as soon after diagnosis as possible. So that the support provided by the school is effective, it is important that a partnership is established between the parent and the school to


