REPORTING TO PARENTS & CARERS UPDATE

As mentioned earlier this year, the Department has made significant changes to the policy around assessment and reporting to parents and carers. Schools have been given the option to implement or adapt templates provided by the Department and can commence the process of creating new templates in consultation with their school community to suit their context. To this end, our staff have chosen to adapt the new templates and adhere to the new guidelines with the view to conducting expansive community consultation throughout 2025 to have a new reporting format created and ready for implementation in 2026. There are subtle changes and some stylistic shifts that parents and carers will notice including:

- Recommended word limits of 150 words for both English and Mathematics.
- Recommended word limit of 200 words for the general comment.
- Kindergarten reports will include reference to all other Key Learning Areas (KLAs) in the general comment.
- Years 1 to 6 reports will highlight each child's overall achievement and effort in other KLAs without a comment. The content previously commented on in other KLAs will now be addressed in parent teacher interviews.
- Years 1 to 6 reports will feature a new 'Plain English achievement scale' This is as follows:

Achievement description	Word descriptor	Grade
Your child's achievement in this subject is outstanding. They confidently apply their knowledge and skills in a range of new and complex situations.	Outstanding	A
Your child's achievement in this subject is high. They confidently apply their knowledge and skills in a range of familiar and new situations.	High	B
Your child's achievement in this subject is at the expected standard. They apply their knowledge and skills in familiar situations.	Expected	C
Your child's achievement in this subject is basic. They apply their knowledge and skills in familiar situations with support.	Basic	D

- **Reporting on effort is now optional.** However, our staff have agreed to continue to use effort descriptors as we feel it will help support conversations with our families during parent teacher interviews. These are now:


