MOBILE PHONES IN NSW PRIMARY SCHOOLS

As previously explained, all mobile phones are banned for children in NSW public primary schools. Mobile phones have been banned in all NSW public primary schools since 13 December, 2018. Any child who has a phone in their bag and brings it to school does so at their own risk. Please do not ask the front office staff or your child's teacher to mind your child's device during the school day.

TERM 4 | WEEK 5 | 11 NOV 2025

We are not accepting the risk of managing personal devices as per advice from DOE legal branch. In addition to this, parents are advised that as of 5 November, 2025, the NSW Government has announced that personal devices are banned in long day care, preschools and before and after school care services and include any personal item capable of capturing, storing, or transmitting images. This includes phones, tablets, iPads, computers, cameras, smartwatches, and wearables such as camera glasses. Family day care educators will need to use a service issued or service authorised device to take images of children with the permission of parents.

SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Huge congratulations to our very own superstar spelling champion Cairo M of S2 Yellow who competed in the state final of the NSW Public School's Premier's Spelling Bee in Penrith last week. Cairo was one of the final 32 students in the state before the competition. During the NSW final he successfully navigated his way through 5 rounds to make the final 16 students before he was eliminated. This year's finalists featured 23 students who speak a language other than English at home, making up 36 per cent of the competing cohort and representing 16 language groups. An incredible effort Cairo – we are all extremely proud of you!






COLOUR RUN 2025 - FUNDRAISING

As most of our community already know, we are holding a colour run on Friday 28 November. Permission notes for this event will be going out later today. The cost per student for the colour run will be \$25 per student and that includes access to the colour run itself, an obstacle course, our first ever silent disco and some other fun Stage based activities. 2027 OPPORTUNITY CLASS AND SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL APPLICATIONS OPEN

Applications for 2027 placement in Year 5 opportunity classes and Year 7 selective high schools open from 6 November 2025 to 20 February 2026.

The application process for 2027 entry into selective high schools and opportunity classes will open on Thursday 6 November 2025. The application link is available at:

Selective high schools and opportunity classes

Students seeking placement in an opportunity class are in Year 3 when applications open and will be in Year 4 when applications close. Students seeking placement in a selective high school are in Year 5 when applications open and in Year 6 when applications close.

ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL - EXTENDED LEAVE APPLICATIONS

Point Clare Public School recognises that families may occasionally need to apply for extended leave from school for travel or other exceptional circumstances. Extended Leave applications are required if a planned absence from school is going to be longer than 5 school days. Under the NSW Department of Education's Student Attendance Policy, family holidays and non-essential travel during school term are not automatically approved and are strongly discouraged, as they can significantly impact student learning and assessment schedules. Parents and carers may apply for Extended Leave when the absence is considered to be in the student's best educational or personal interest.

CLASS PLACEMENTS 2026 - REPEAT

This year we are asking that all families refine the focus of their class requests to considerations around your child or children's specific educational needs, health care supports and preferences for potential learning spaces. Additionally, all requests for individual class teachers for 2026 will not be considered due to several staff taking leave and members of the teaching staff changing to different Stages of learning.

All requests must be submitted via the google form link provided below for consideration. The google link will remain open until 4pm on 20 Thursday November at which point it will be locked so that the teachers can begin the process of assigning classes. Please be advised that all final decisions on class placements will be made by the teaching staff.


